

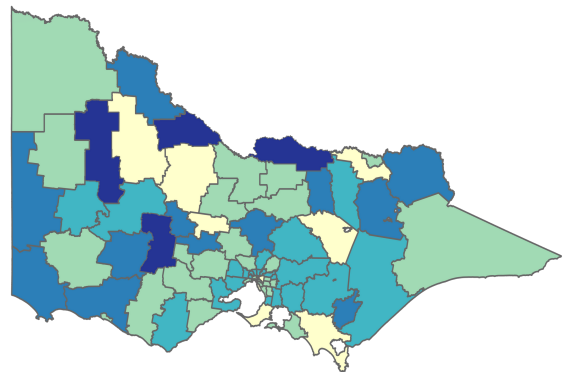
Victorian Women's Health Atlas Overview

What is the Atlas?

- Free, interactive data platform launched in 2015 that displays health and social wellbeing indicators, mapped by sex, for every local government area in Victoria.
- Reliable source of sex-disaggregated data to support gender equality and health promotion work at statewide, regional and local government level.
- 70+ indicators on the platform, grouped into 8 categories:
 - Sexual and Reproductive Health
 - Violence Against Women
 - Mental Health
 - Cancer
 - Healthy Living
 - Chronic Disease
 - Socioeconomics
 - Populations
- Many Atlas indicators have 8 or more years of data.
- Many Atlas datasets are not readily available elsewhere, such as medical termination of pregnancy.

Atlas data visualisation

- The Atlas is designed to simply and effectively show:
 - What's the story for women and how is it different to the story for men?
 - What's the story by location? (statewide / regions / local areas)
 - What are the trends over time?
 - What is this data and where does it come from?
 - Why is this issue important for women's wellbeing? (gender analysis)
- Data views and outputs include:
 - maps,
 - bar charts,
 - trend graphs,
 - data tables,
 - fact sheets, and
 - supporting text (description, gender analysis, data processing notes, data source).



Atlas reach and impact

- All-time reach since launch is 30,000 visitors, and 290,000 page views.
- Trusted data source to support evidence-based planning, advocacy, program design, monitoring and evaluation by Victorian women's health services, state and local government, health services and community organisations.
- Leading practice resource to support public sector agencies to meet their obligations under the Gender Equality Act 2020.
- Australian-first mapping of medication abortion and long-acting reversible contraception, highlighting differences in local demand and supply from 2017-2021.
- Publication of the above data is a game-changer, informing statewide and region-specific efforts to address service gaps.
- The Atlas tells the story of women's health and gender equality in Victoria visually using multiple interrelated indicators.
- Intersectional data resources including:
 - Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander women
 - LGBTIQ+ community,
 - Migrant and Refugee women
 - Young women and girls and older women
 - Women in the justice system
 - Women with disabilities
- Uptake within and beyond Victoria for research and education.
